**THE VALLEY ECONOMIC ALLIANCE ADOPTS COVID-19 RECOVERY PLAN**

*Valley of the Stars – Rising* will drive economic recovery in the Valley

**Sherman Oaks, California** – The Valley Economic Alliance (“Alliance”), the premiere economic development organization in the San Fernando Valley, announced its Board of Directors unanimously approved a strategic map to lead an economic recovery in the Valley that is fast, strong, and inclusive.

“The *Valley of the Stars – Rising* campaign is designed to jump start the Valley’s economy in response to the impact of the COVID-19 crisis,” said Sonya Blake, President & CEO. “This map implements key elements of our Strategic Plan in ways that are tailored to meet current challenges and develop our long-term vision of economic prosperity that lifts everyone in the Valley.”

Some highlights of the *Valley of the Stars – Rising* recovery map include: bringing urgently needed capital and technical assistance to Valley businesses; getting Valley residents back to work, with virtual career fairs and training connections; identifying shovel ready projects for funding opportunities, and; marketing the *Valley of the Stars* and stimulating spending in Valley neighborhoods. “Our *Back to Business* webinars are one example under this map,” said Blake.

“We are facing the greatest economic crisis the San Fernando Valley has ever experienced, and it’s all hands on deck,” stated Fred Gaines, Chairman of the Alliance. “The Alliance has already begun to mobilize the Valley business community, work with public and private equity leaders, and execute our strategies for recovery. We will be the leading catalyst to stimulate the economic resurgence of the Valley to ensure our region remains a great place to live, work, learn and play.
